R. R. He has been deeply involved in the movement to renew Catholic education and co-authored the curricula for two schools.

THOMAS S. BUCHANAN is the George W. Laird Professor Emeritus of Mechanical Engineering and Biomedical Engineering at the University of Delaware. He has studied at UCSD, Northwestern University, and MIT, and has held visiting professorships at the University of Western Australia and the University of Aix-Marseille in France. He holds the rank of Fellow in four professional societies and has held leadership positions such as president of the American Society of Biomechanics and editor-inchief of the Journal of Applied Biomechanics. He also has an MTh in Applied Orthodox Theology from Saint John of Damascus School of Theology of the University of Balamand. Dr. Buchanan is a senior editor of *Touchstone* and *Salvo*.
